Exegetical Notes, Numbers 18:1-32 "Obligations and Rewards"

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NUMBERS 18:1-32

Verses 1-7

The LORD said to Aaron, "You, your sons and your family are to bear the responsibility for offenses connected with the sanctuary, and you and your sons alone are to bear the responsibility for offenses connected with the priesthood. ² Bring your fellow Levites from your ancestral tribe to join you and assist you when you and your sons minister before the tent of the covenant law. ³ They are to be responsible to you and are to perform all the duties of the tent, but they must not go near the furnishings of the sanctuary or the altar. Otherwise both they and you will die. ⁴ They are to join you and be responsible for the care of the tent of meeting—all the work at the tent—and no one else may come near where you are. "You are to be responsible for the care of the sanctuary and the altar, so that my wrath will not fall on the Israelites again. ⁶ I myself have selected your fellow Levites from among the Israelites as a gift to you, dedicated to the LORD to do the work at the tent of meeting. ⁷ But only you and your sons may serve as priests in connection with everything at the altar and inside the curtain. I am giving you the service of the priesthood as a gift. Anyone else who comes near the sanctuary is to be put to death."

- These verses are clearly connected with Numbers 17:12-13. The people were afraid that they had offended God by their failure to trust him and obey him, and by supporting Korah's rebellion against Moses and Aaron. They are afraid to come before God at the Tent of Meeting for fear that they will be killed in judgment. So God makes it clear that part of the job of the priests is to make sure that the people obey the rules when they come before God at the Tent of Meeting. The priests will be held responsible if the people violate the rules regarding the Tent of Meeting.
- The rule is very simple. While the people may come to the Tent of Meeting to meet with God, no one but Aaron, his sons, and the other members of their extended family (the tribe of Levi) may ever enter

- the tent. And no one but the priests may actually touch the furniture in the tent.
- While the entire tribe of Levi (22,000 men) is chosen to assist Moses and Aaron at the tent, and in moving the tent, they are all responsible to Aaron. If they disobey the rules related to the Tent of Meeting, the priests, Aaron and his sons, will be held responsible before God. The offending party and the priests in charge will die.
- The point is that the people have been forgiven for their rebellion, however, now the priests are responsible for making sure that the people obey God at the Tent of Meeting.
- God makes it very clear that he has chosen Aaron and his sons to serve as Israel's priests. He makes it very clear that the role of the Levites is to assist the priests. He makes it clear that though these jobs bring great responsibilities, they are to be regarded as gifts from God. God's gifts always bring responsibilities.

Verses 8-20

Then the LORD said to Aaron, "I myself have put you in charge of the offerings presented to me; all the holy offerings the Israelites give me I give to you and your sons as your portion, your perpetual share. ⁹ You are to have the part of the most holy offerings that is kept from the fire. From all the gifts they bring me as most holy offerings, whether grain or sin or guilt offerings, that part belongs to you and your sons. ¹⁰ Eat it as something most holy; every male shall eat it. You must regard it as holy.

¹¹ "This also is yours: whatever is set aside from the gifts of all the wave offerings of the Israelites. I give this to you and your sons and daughters as your perpetual share. Everyone in your household who is ceremonially clean may eat it.

¹² "I give you all the finest olive oil and all the finest new wine and grain they give the LORD as the firstfruits of their harvest. ¹³ All the land's firstfruits that they bring to the LORD will be yours. Everyone in your household who is ceremonially clean may eat it.

¹⁴ "Everything in Israel that is devoted to the LORD is yours. ¹⁵ The first offspring of every womb, both human and animal, that is offered to the LORD is yours. But you must redeem every firstborn son and every firstborn male of unclean animals. ¹⁶ When they are a month old, you must

redeem them at the redemption price set at five shekels of silver, according to the sanctuary shekel, which weighs twenty gerahs.

¹⁷ "But you must not redeem the firstborn of a cow, a sheep or a goat; they are holy. Splash their blood against the altar and burn their fat as a food offering, an aroma pleasing to the LORD. ¹⁸ Their meat is to be yours, just as the breast of the wave offering and the right thigh are yours. ¹⁹ Whatever is set aside from the holy offerings the Israelites present to the LORD I give to you and your sons and daughters as your perpetual share. It is an everlasting covenant of salt before the LORD for both you and your offspring."

²⁰ The LORD said to Aaron, "You will have no inheritance in their land, nor will you have any share among them; I am your share and your inheritance among the Israelites.

• Because the Levites are not to receive a portion of the Promised Land, Aaron and his descendants are given the offerings of Israel as their rightful inheritance. Since they are responsible for caring for the religious life of the nation, they will have no time to farm or work the land. This was God's decree to care for them

Verses 21-24

"I give to the Levites all the tithes in Israel as their inheritance in return for the work they do while serving at the tent of meeting. ²² From now on the Israelites must not go near the tent of meeting, or they will bear the consequences of their sin and will die. ²³ It is the Levites who are to do the work at the tent of meeting and bear the responsibility for any offenses they commit against it. This is a lasting ordinance for the generations to come. They will receive no inheritance among the Israelites. ²⁴ Instead, I give to the Levites as their inheritance the tithes that the Israelites present as an offering to the LORD. That is why I said concerning them: 'They will have no inheritance among the Israelites.'"

• Because the others members of the tribe of Levi will not inherit a portion of the Promised Land, they are to be given the Israelites' tithes as their rightful portion.

Verses 25-32

The LORD said to Moses, ²⁶ "Speak to the Levites and say to them: 'When you receive from the Israelites the tithe I give you as your inheritance, you must present a tenth of that tithe as the LORD's offering. ²⁷ Your offering

will be reckoned to you as grain from the threshing floor or juice from the winepress. ²⁸ In this way you also will present an offering to the LORD from all the tithes you receive from the Israelites. From these tithes you must give the LORD's portion to Aaron the priest. ²⁹ You must present as the LORD's portion the best and holiest part of everything given to you.' ³⁰ "Say to the Levites: 'When you present the best part, it will be reckoned to you as the product of the threshing floor or the winepress. ³¹ You and your households may eat the rest of it anywhere, for it is your wages for your work at the tent of meeting. ³² By presenting the best part of it you will not be guilty in this matter; then you will not defile the holy offerings of the Israelites, and you will not die."

• Even though the Levites and the priests receive what has already been offered to the Lord, they must still tithe what they receive. Tithing is a holy act required of all God's people.
