By signing the covenant, we indicate that we understand the obligations that come with being part of the family of God that meets at Cornerstone. Further, we acknowledge our need for each other if we are to walk in the ways in which He leads. We renew our commitment to God and each other by signing the covenant annually. This annual covenant renewal recalls those obligations to our minds and reaffirms their importance in our lives.

On Sundays, October 2, 9, 16, 23, & 30 2016, we invite you to enter, or reenter, into covenant with all the people of this congregation by signing, or re-signing, the church covenant.

What a wonderful example of what it means to be followers of Christ and members of His family.

PUTTING FIRST THINGS FIRST

The world that we live in is filled with activity. It seems like everywhere we turn there is something or someone needing our time and attention. However, with only twenty-four hours in a day, there is only so much we can do. That is why it is critical that we establish proper priorities.

The Bible says that we are to live purposefully and worthily and accurately, not as the unwise and witless, but as wise (sensible, intelligent people), making the very most of the time because the days are evil (Ephesians 5:15, 16).

In order to make the most of everything God has given us, we need to make Him top priority in our lives. By asking ourselves some straightforward questions and answering them as honestly as possible, we can discover where God fits in our lives in relation to everything else. We will find that when we put Him first and follow the leading of His Spirit, everything else falls into its proper place.

Many years ago, I remember hearing the scripture you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind (Matthew 22:37). Right away, this began to bother me because I knew that God was not first in my life. But God used this scripture to drive me to seek a deeper relationship with Him.

At that time I was born again, but my relationship with God was shallow – I was a Christian in name only. I loved the Lord, but I didn't love Him enough to do what He told me; I was just going through the motions (sound familiar). I had inserted Jesus into my program, hoping He would make everything in my life work. However, that was not the position He wanted to fill.

God wants to be first in everything. In Exodus 20:3 God said, *You shall have no other gods before or beside Me.* This was the first commandment that God gave, so I believe it is probably the most important. I have found that if I put my marriage before my personal relationship with God, my marriage suffers. The same is true if I put my children before my relationship with God. Although my husband and my kids are very important, God must be first. If He isn't, I won't have the strength and ability to have and enjoy a relationship with them or anyone else.

Putting God first means to put His ways first –to live the way He would live. What God loves, we must learn to love; what God hates, we must learn to hate. For example, God loves people, so we need to learn to love people. God hates evil, so we need to learn to hate evil

I have discovered that one of the best ways to see how God would live is to observe the way Jesus His Son lived. Jesus said, I am the Way and the Truth and the Life; no one comes to the Father except by Me (John 14:6). I believe that one of the things that Jesus was trying to say was, "If you study my life, you will see how I treated people, how I handled situations, and the way I fellowshiped with the Father. If you follow my example, you will be blessed."

Jesus really got this point across in Matthew 6:33. He said, Seek first of all His kingdom and His righteousness, and then all these things taken together will be given you besides. So seeking the kingdom of God means finding out how God wants things done and then doing them His way through the power of His Spirit.

In order to truly be set free and begin to experience the blessings of God in our lives, you and I need to face the truth. If we really want to grow to the next level of faith and service, then we need to get honest with ourselves and with God about where we are and what our priorities are. This may be a bit painful, if we are truly honest, but the outcome will be powerful.

I challenge you to regularly stop and take a good look at your life. Ask the Holy Spirit to show you where your priorities are out of line. Then allow His conviction to motivate you to seek a deeper relationship with God. Give God all that you <u>are</u> and all that you are <u>not</u> – surrender to Him your strengths and your weaknesses. If you see that you've done something wrong, recognize it, repent, receive God's forgiveness, and press on to a higher level in Him.

Remember, it is God through the power of the Holy Spirit that will give you the ability to adjust your lifestyle and bring it in line with the Word (see 1 Thessalonians 5:23). He will enable you to put Him first in your thoughts, conversations and actions — He will show you how to place Him first in your time, money, relationships and decision-making.

Even though it may not seem like things are changing, they are. No matter how big of a mess your life is in, God will turn it around and bless you if you put Him first and refuse to quit. **If you have**

accepted Jesus as the Savior of your soul, I encourage you to let Him be the Lord of your life. When you put God first in everything you do, you are destined for success!

Have you seen this story?

Several years ago, a friend and her husband were invited to spend the weekend at the husband's employer's home. The wife was nervous about the weekend. The boss was very wealthy, with a fine home on the waterway, and cars costing more than her house.

The first day and evening went well and the wife was delighted to have this rare glimpse into how the very wealthy live. The husband's employer was quite generous as a host, and took them to the finest restaurants. The wife knew she would never have the opportunity to indulge in this kind of extravagance again, so she was enjoying herself immensely.

As the three of them were about to enter an exclusive restaurant one evening, the boss was walking slightly ahead of the woman and her husband. He stopped suddenly, looking down on the pavement for a long, silent moment. The wife wondered if she was supposed to pass him. There was nothing on the ground except a single darkened penny that someone had dropped, and a few cigarette butts.

Still silent, the man reached down and picked up the penny. He held it up and smiled, then put it in his pocket as if he had found a great treasure.

How absurd! What need did this man have for a single penny? Why would he even take the time to stop and pick it up?

Throughout dinner, the entire scene nagged at her. Finally, she could stand it no longer. She casually mentioned that her daughter once had a coin collection, and asked if the penny he had found had been valuable.

A smile crept across the man's face as he reached into his pocket for the penny and held it out for her to see. She had seen many pennies before. What was the point of this?

"Look at it," he said. "Read what it says." She read the words "United States of America." "No, not that; read further." "One cent?" "No, keep reading."

"In God We Trust?" "YES!" "And?" "And if I trust in God, the name of God is holy, even on a coin.

Whenever I find a coin, I see that inscription. It is written on every single United States coin, but we never seem to notice it. God drops a message right in front of me telling me to trust Him. Who am I to pass it by?

When I see a coin, I pray, I stop to see if my trust IS in God at that moment. I pick the coin up as a response to God; that I do trust in Him. For a short time, at least, I cherish it as if it were gold. I think it is God's way of starting a conversation with me. Lucky for me, God is patient and pennies are plentiful."

(When I was out shopping, I found a penny on the sidewalk. I stopped and picked it up, and realized that I had been worrying

and fretting in my mind about things I cannot change. I read the words, "In God We Trust," and had to laugh. Yes, God, I get the message. It seems that I have been finding an inordinate amount of pennies in the last few months, but then, pennies are plentiful. And God is patient.)

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HERE'S HOW YOU CAN START TRUSTING JESUS CHRIST WITH YOUR CARES & CONCERNS A RIGHT FOCUS

When troubles come your way, look beyond the present. Focus on the promises God has for your future, both on this earth and for eternity –'For I know the plans I have for you,' declares the Lord, 'plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future' (Jeremiah 29:11). Being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus (Philippians 1:6).

AN OPPORTUNITY TO GROW

Accept your suffering as an opportunity to grow in your faith. God can use your trials to teach you and to make you a stronger Christian — Consider it pure joy, my brothers (and sisters), whenever you face trials of many kinds, because you know that the testing of your faith develops perseverance. Perseverance must finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything (James 1:2-4). No discipline seems pleasant at the time, but painful. Later on, however, it produces a harvest of righteousness and peace for those who have been trained by it (Hebrews 12:11).

AN EXPECTATION OF SUFFERING

Remember that Christ did not promise a life of ease for those who follow Him; He told us that as His true disciples, we would have to endure hardship, persecution, and suffering. As the disciples did, embrace suffering for Christ. An eternity spent with Him is worth far more than anything this fleeting life can offer —

I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world (John 16:33). I consider that our present sufferings are not worth comparing with the glory that will be revealed in us (Romans 8:18).

GROW IN CHRIST

Make sure you are not neglecting your daily walk with Christ. This is essential to finding peace, wisdom, and joy for the road ahead. Spend time each day studying the Scriptures and pouring out your heart to God in prayer. Also, share your burdens with other believers who can support you and pray with you – For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through endurance and the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope (Romans 15:4). Trust in Him at all times, you people; pour out your heart before Him; God is a refuge for us (Psalm 62:8).

THE LORD'S INDWELLING

In his book <u>The Imitation of Christ,</u> Thomas A Kempis writes speaking as God,

"I am the lover of purity and the giver of all holiness. I seek a pure heart and there I make my resting place.... If you want me to come to you and to remain with you, rid yourself of the old leaven and cleanse the dwelling place of your heart.

"Nevertheless, you must realize that you cannot make adequate preparation for Me through your own merits, even if you prepared for an entire year with your mind on nothing else. It is through My generosity and love that you are invited to come to Me; just as if a beggar were invited to a rich man's dinner and could only say thanks for the kindness shown to him.

"Do the best you can and as well as you can; not from habit or necessity, but with reverential fear and affection.... Remember who condescends to come to you! I am He who invited you! I will make up whatever is lacking in you. Come, then, and receive Me!"

Always and completely we are dependent on Christ to finish the process of our salvation. But we are called to make the best preparations for Him in our hearts that we can make. Moses said that we should be holy as God is holy because God is holy (Leviticus 11:44-45). Jesus told us to be perfect (the Greek word means complete or whole) as God is perfect (Matthew 5:28). The apostle Paul told us to work out our salvation with fear and trembling (Philippians 2:12). Even though we are dependent on Jesus, there is clearly a scriptural obligation placed on each of us to be "growing" in our relationship with Jesus Christ. But how do we grow in our relationship with Him?

We grow in our relationship with the Lord through the study and diligent application of the truths taught in His word. The process begins at our celebrations. The author of Hebrews wrote, "do not forsake the assembling of yourselves together" (Hebrews 10:25) for in so doing we "spur one another toward love and good deeds" (Hebrews 10:24). How is your attendance at our celebrations? Are you there to spur others towards love and good works and so others can spur you on to the same? The process continues through our attendance at an Adult Bible Fellowship (Sunday School Class). There, we pray for each other and love and encourage each other. There, we begin to work together to bring others into relationship with Him. Are you attending an ABF? The process continues as we become involved in a Spiritual Growth Group where we become involved

in understanding and applying the teachings of the scripture in a group of friends who hold us lovingly accountable to the process of growing in the Lord. **Are you attending a Spiritual Growth Group?**

Thomas A Kempis wrote, "Try the best you can...." And he promised that if we do, Christ will make up the shortage. But, are you really trying the best you can to prepare your heart for the Lord's indwelling?

THE WORLD'S MOST GENEROUS PEOPLE

Here are some interesting facts:

- → No developed country approaches American giving.

- conservative" made up less than one-fifth of the population, but donated more than a quarter of the blood.
- Charitable giving in America has generally risen faster than the growth of the economy for more than half a century.
- Tax deductibility for charitable donations is irrelevant for most Americans.
- → IRS records show that only about a third of people who file tax returns itemize their deductions, which means that most Americans don't even claim the deductions to which they are entitled.

The truth is, unlike Christianity, most religions in this world do not foster concern or care for other people. Most major religions have a fatalistic worldview and do not believe in a personal God who cares how humans treat one another. Christians believe that God is watching how we behave while we are here on Earth, and Jesus admonished us to practice acts of kindness, benevolence and charity because doing so pleases God. The Bible teaches that those who live by these values will be rewarded spiritually and otherwise here and in the hereafter. And the bonus is that it blesses us even in the present.

- 5. It ministers to your mind, body and spirit (Proverbs 4:20-22).
- 6. It helps you maintain your mental health (Romans 12:2).
- 7. It increases the anointing on every area of your life (Proverbs 1:3).
- 9. It enhances your intellect and personality (1 Corinthians 1:5). 10. It pours grace, joy and peace into your spirit, your mind and your life (2 Corinthians 1:2, 1 Timothy 1:2, Galatians 5:22).

Reading 3 chapters a day from the Word of God will greatly bless your life. Lets make it a high priority every day. And Parents, have your children read 2 or 3 chapters out loud to you. It will greatly bless them and you.
