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## A TIME TO RETREAT?

(some thoughts based on Matthew 2:13-15 and 19-23) People can be very vicious. We tend to pick on the inadequacies or idiosyncrasies of other people. These tactics are used especially against those whom we are quite certain will not or cannot retaliate.

If we are, or think we are, on the receiving end of such attacks, there are times when we feel compelled to react. There are times when we would rather take a physical or verbal beating than endure the taunts.

The text above deals with the decision of Joseph to take Mary and Jesus away from the threats of Herod. Perhaps you have wondered,"Why should they have gone? Would not God have protected them? Did Joseph exhibit poor judgment and a lack of faith?"

The lesson to be learned is that "to everything there is a season." There are times to fight and times to flee. Joseph made a decision that the best thing to do was to leave Israel and flee to Egypt.

Put yourself in Joseph's place for a moment. An angel warns him that the king and his forces are intent upon killing the baby. How would you feel if you knew there was an all-points bulletin out for your child? Mary and Joseph knew that the baby was someone very special. They also knew something of the hate that humankind can demonstrate.

There are times in the church when we feel like "they are against me." At such times, there is a temptation to run to a far land and avoid the slings and arrows of fellow church members. Then, there are those other times, when we summon the courage, and we stick out our necks.

The text suggests that there is a time to withdraw – to go on retreat, if you will. The world is complex. There are daily anxiety-producing events. Personalities and forces invade our space and send us into a spin of emotions. And, we become so preoccupied with all of this activity that we lose our spiritual base. God suddenly becomes crowded out of our lives, and we do what WE want to do. Joseph had the

good sense to continue listening to God even in the midst of fearing for the lives of his family.

In the days following Christmas, how many of us are so exhausted that we have literally forgotten about God? The parties and celebrations have drained us. What has become of our prayers and our devotional life?

The time is ripe for refueling our spiritual lives. The spiritual base needs to be reconnected. Recall the times in Jesus' ministry when he retreated from the hectic pace, to be alone and to pray.

The function of a "vacation" is to provide with time to rejuvenate. However, we can never afford to take a vacation from God. When we remove him we fall out of balance and we run low on the spiritual fuel that makes life meaningful.

One of the ways we might begin to refuel our lives is to shut off the noise in our lives. It might be a television or a radio. I am convinced that NOISE is a great contributor to a spiritual imbalance. The time comes for SILENCE. The time comes for listening to God. The time comes for sharing with those we love versus merely existing with them. The time comes for prayers and reflection.

In other words, the time comes when we must set aside our personal agendas and turn our lives over to God and TRUST HIM! Joseph listened to God!

We need to MAKE the time for this renewal or it will not happen. If we are too busy, then we are TOO BUSY!

But, when we allow God once again to enter our lives we will discover an energy that had been sapped from us. We will feel our convictions and courage enriched. We will discover that we are alive and creative once again.

Mary, Joseph and Jesus retreated to Egypt, but they did not stay there. They returned to the battle. Recall that many years later, at the Transfiguration, Jesus would literally kick Peter, James and John off the mountain and back into the battle of the world.

There is a time for everything: a time to fight, a time to rest and a time to return to the fight in the name of Christ. In the end, those who follow Christ are always in the midst of the battle against sin and the forces of evil.

Perhaps the New Year will hold times of transition for you. You may want to flee, but remember that those who stand firm to the end will be saved. We, even now, are engaged in a great spiritual battle against the forces of evil – forces that would drive us apart, forces that would pit us against one another, forces that would deny the power and glory of the great Almighty God, forces that would rob us of the joy of serving the Lord together.

In the New Year before us, may God find us faithful in His service, and abounding in mercy and grace towards one another, even as we have received mercy and grace.

"The queen sent me with this letter," he said, "and also asked me to thank you personally for the loan of your umbrella." Stunned, the woman burst into tears. "Oh, what an opportunity I missed that I did not give her my very best," she cried. Many, I fear, will have to make the same confession when they face the Lord at the end of life's road.

Let past mistakes stay in the past! Never become discouraged; instead, reach for the higher blessings of the Spirit which come only to those who walk in close fellowship with the Lord -- those who walk down the center of the "Jesus way." Remember that the narrow road leads to LIFE. Why not make George Burger's practical suggestions your goal for the coming year?

The New Year lies before you like a spotless track of snow, Be careful how you tread it, For every mark will show!

As the New Year dawns, may the Lord give us a vision of His will for us in the days ahead and the strength to carry on. May He increase our faith, renew our hope and be our quide, in the name of Christ – Amen.

# THE NEW YEAR

At the birth of the twentieth century, ministers, teachers and other leaders had high hopes for the century to follow. They knew that the year 1900 stood on the threshold of new discoveries in science, and they believed that science might become our "savior." They knew that we stood on the threshold of new economic discoveries and they believed that economics might "redeem" us. They knew that we stood on the threshold of new discoveries in transportation, which would make the world one. So, as the 1800's faded away, celebrations were held all over the world to usher in the new "millennium."

In Boston, crowds gathered in the streets. Up and down Beacon Hill they marched, singing and making revelry as only a New Year's Eve crowd can do. On the stroke of twelve, thousands thronged Boston Common for a service of worship. Edward Everett Hale was the featured speaker. With the wind whipping his coat, he rose, held up both hands, and with earnestness pronounced the words, "O Lord, thou hast been our dwelling place in all generations. Before the mountains were brought forth, even from everlasting to everlasting, thou art God."

A Boston newspaper commented on the speech by saying that this brief statement was the finest tribute that might be paid to the new year. Hale knew that unless the twentieth century became the century of God, it would become a century of failure.

Hopefully we have learned that the new discoveries in science, though wonderful, cannot save us, nor can the new discoveries in economics redeem us. And the new discoveries in transportation, though stupendous, made it possible for evil people to use this invention to kill and maim men, women and children.

As Christians approach another new year, they must pray again that God will redeem yet another year, and create his "holy city." God is trustworthy and true. He is the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. He is, indeed, our dwelling place in all generations. May we be at the forefront in bringing America back to the Lord.

"And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: 'Give me a light, that I may tread safely into the unknown!'

And he replied:
