Psalm 63:1

O God, You are my God;

Early will I seek You;

My soul thirsts for You;

My flesh longs for You

In a dry and thirsty land

Where there is no water.

- The author of this Psalm (historically attributed to King David) is in a dry, parched land. There is no water available to refresh him.
- Despite his circumstances, he longs for God. He declares that he will seek God early each day. He declares that his soul thirsts for God and that his flesh longs for God. He recognizes that there is no other god. There is no other place of refuge except God.
